Our 2019-2020 (April 2019-March 2020) budget is \$42,522.00 and as of 1/31/2020 we have used \$26, 137.35. Someone asked about total of income that we have control of. Gary shared that it is 6%. There was also discussion regarding the life of our roofs.

- 2. The motion was made and seconded to pay the COA an annual an annual total amount of \$5.00 per unit, this includes the annual COA membership dues, the Library Fund and Health Services. Motion passed.
- 3. The motion was made and seconded to waive the requirement for an Audited Financial Statement and provide in lieu thereof, a Report of Cash Receipts and Expenditures for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2020 in accordance with Chapter 718.111 (13) of the Florida Statutes and 61B—22.006 of the Florida Administrative Code. Motion passed.
- 4. Resolution Motion was made by Tom Arvanites to approve; Seconded by Barbara Cox to amend Article XIII -USE AND OCCUPANCY of the Declaration of Condominium to permit certain pets in accordance with the Proposed Amendment distributed with the Notice and Agenda of this Annual Meeting. There was a vote of 83 Yeas (motion did not pass). As some members were unable to vote and ballots cast incorrectly, a suggestion was made that the meeting be recessed and completed at a later date.
- 5. Budget Review: The proposed assessment for April 1, 2020 and ends March 31, 2021 reflects an increase of \$6.55 per unit in monthly assessments.
